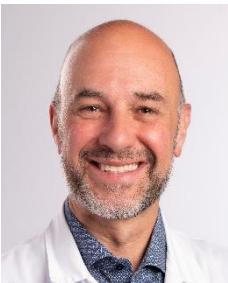
Dr méd. Matteo Coen
